



HomeBase was created in 2009 in a response to the recession. NHA wanted to increase its ability to support the community during this time and best practice showed that it was more cost effective for everyone to prevent homelessness before it begins. HomeBase provides homelessness prevention and homeless assistance services. We are able to work with households to prevent an eviction from their current housing or assist in finding housing if a household is living with friends or family. We also provide rapid re-housing services to households currently experiencing homelessness. In order to overcome recidivism, HomeBase may be able to provide short term or medium term rental subsidies to achieve stabilization. HomeBase services are provided to families with children, single, couples, seniors, veterans, or anyone in need. Services are dependent upon funding availability and funding guidelines.

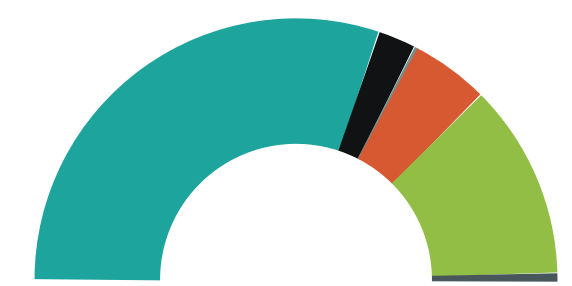

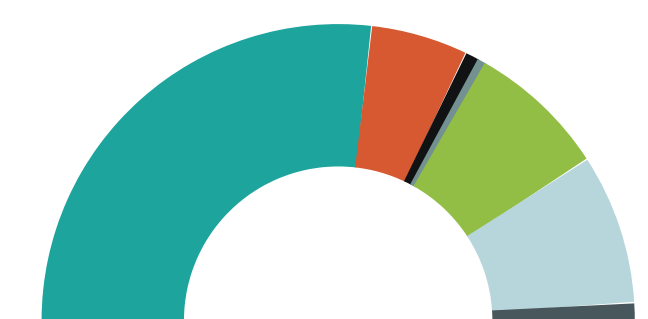
