



## Pathways

Pathways is a partnership with the Oregon Health Authority and Clackamas County Behavioral Health. Participants are referred through the county. Participants are impacted by severe and persistent mental illness, and services are provided to ensure success in living independently. The program provides housing support, landlord retention, and peer supports along with an ongoing rental subsidy.

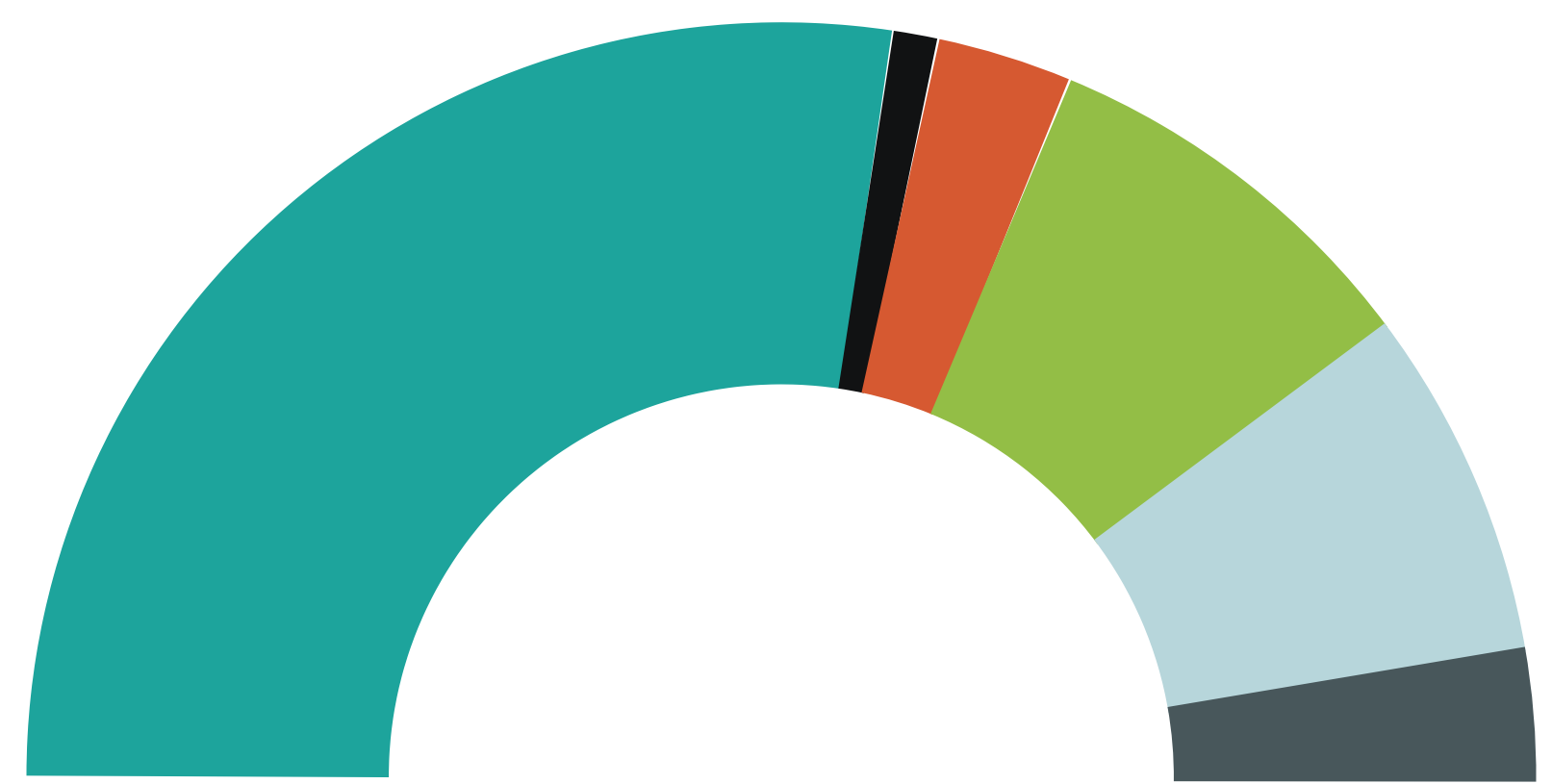

## DHS Partnership

In June of 2018, HIS entered into a partnership with DHS serving families who either are receiving TANF or working on reunifying families through child welfare program to provide housing stabilization. Similar to other housing stabilization services, this program works to either keep families in their current homes or house them after they've experienced homelessness.

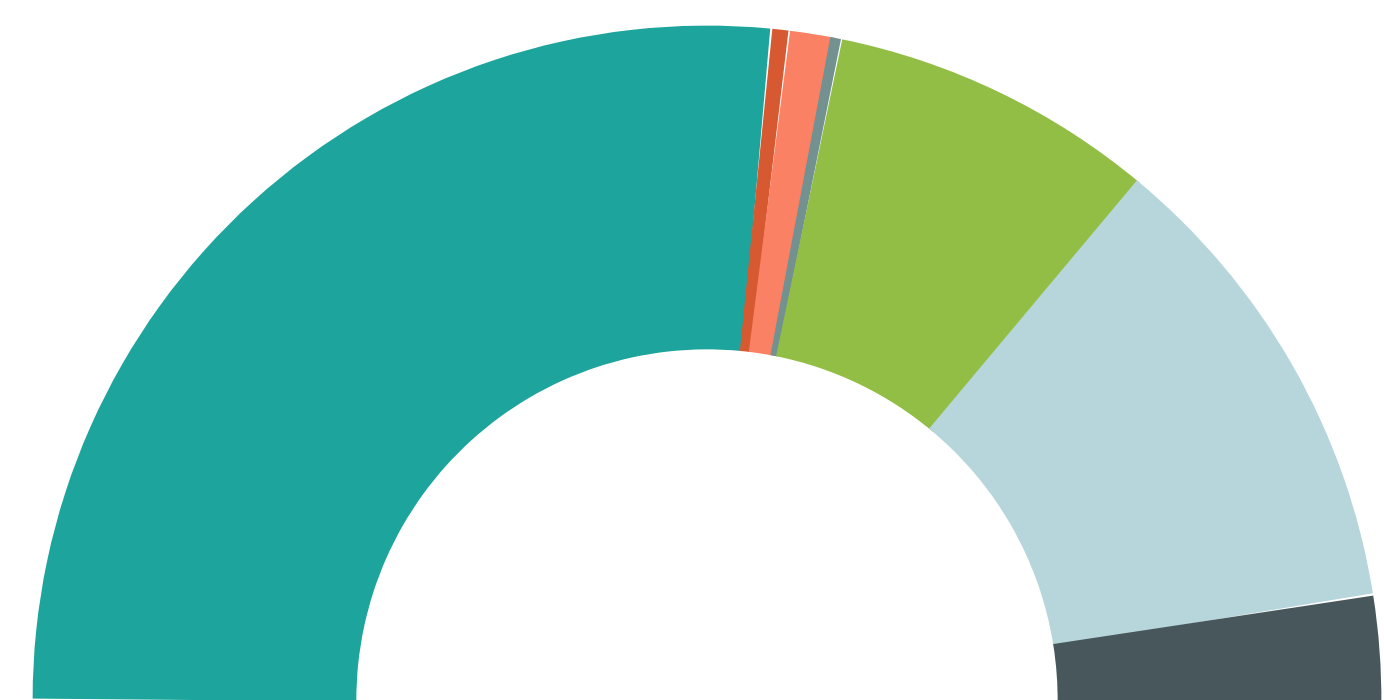
